

DEPARTMENT 003 – SWINE

Fair Year: 2017

Entries must be made by July 31 of exhibit year.
Open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Swine project or youth of other groups doing equivalent work.
Judging will be on Friday beginning at 8:30 am.
Hogs that weigh under 230 pounds will be shown in the junior class light weight division.
Note: Market Animal Sale requirements are listed in a separate document.

No hay or bedding may be stored in the barns.
Bred and owned is defined as the dam/mother needs to be owned by the exhibitor or immediate family member.

Rules Governing Swine Exhibits

- a. See health regulations.
- b. Swine shown in Junior Fair not eligible for Open Class.
- c. The Danish system of judging will be used.

DIVISION 23 – MARKET HOGS

Class No. Premiums: \$6.00 - \$5.00 - \$4.00 - \$3.00

1. Market hog – 140-230 pounds (light weight)
2. Market hog – 230 or over (heavy weight)
3. Carcass hog – 230 or over. Carcass placings will be determined by ultrasound scanning.
4. Bred and Owned

DIVISION 24 – SHOWMANSHIP (Swine)

Danish Judging

Entry must be on an entry blank.

Exhibitors must show their own animals in showmanship classes.

Open to 4-H and FFA members
(Grade just completed.)

Class No. Premiums: \$3.00 - \$2.50 - \$2.00 - \$1.50

1. Grades 3-5
2. Grades 6-7
3. Grades 8-9
4. Grades 10 and above
