Definition of Age Classification

Individual Classes – Dairy Cattle

- a. A spring calf is one born on or after March 1 of the exhibit year.
- b. A winter calf is one whose date of birth is between December 1 of the year preceding the exhibit year and February 28 or 29 of the exhibit year.
- c. A fall calf is one whose date of birth is between September 1 and November 30 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
- d. A summer yearling is one whose date of birth is between June 1 and August 31 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
- e. A spring yearling is one whose date of birth is between March 1 and May 31 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
- f. A winter yearling is one whose date of birth is between December 1 of the second year preceding the exhibit year and February 28 or 29 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
- g. A fall yearling is one whose date of birth is between September 1 and November 30 of the second year preceding the exhibit year.
- h. A 2-year old is one whose date of birth is between September 1 of the third year preceding the exhibit year and August 31 of the second year preceding the exhibit year. A 2-year old includes a yearling that has freshened.
- i. A 3-year old is one whose date of birth is between September 1 of the fourth year preceding the exhibit year and August 31 of the third year preceding the exhibit year.
- j. A 4-year old is one whose date of birth is between September 1 of the fifth year preceding the exhibit year and August 31 of the fourth year preceding the exhibit year.
- k. A 5-year old is one whose date of birth is between September 1 of the sixth year preceding the exhibit year and August 31 of the fifth year preceding the exhibit year.
- l. A dry cow is one not less than three years old which is not currently lactating, but has milked 280 days or more since last fair season.

- m. A dairy junior get-of-sire shall consist of 3 animals which are the offspring of the same bull. All of these animals shall be under 2 years of age, and not more than one can be a bull.
- n. A dairy senior get-of-sire shall consist of 3 animals which are the offspring of one sire. All of these animals shall be over 2 years of age, and not more than one can be a bull.
- o. A produce of a dam shall consist of 2 animals, any age and any sex which are the produce of one cow.
- p. A group of 3 best female cattle shall consist of 3 animals, any age, all bred by exhibitor.
- q. NOTE: (Get-of-Sire) Name of sire to be designed and the animals need not be owned by exhibitor.
- r. RULE: A production award will be given in all milking age classes to the animal with the highest Official Test Record for butterfat. Bring DHIA sheet to the judges' stand before class judging begins.

Milking Procedure and Rules for Calumet County Fair

- 1. All cows in milk at the County Fair are to be milked in the milking facility. No exceptions will be granted. Buckets will be available for dumping with antibiotic residue and for fresh cows.
- 2. Milking time: Mornings – 5:00-8:00 am; Evenings – 4:00-6:00 pm Except for Friday night when the milking area will be open and supervised for bagging.
- 3. Cows are to be milked following recommended milking practices, (example) use of strip cup for bloody or mastitic milk; use of teat dip, etc.
- 4. All milk will be tested for antibiotic residue. Any milk with residue must be dumped and milk from future milkings will not be included in the tank. Strict adherence to this policy will be maintained.
- 5. Milk House supervision: Any questions or problems should be directed to Dairy Superintendents.
- 6. No clipping of cattle will be allowed in the alleys or doorways of any barn.
- 7. No clipping will be allowed in cattle barns after 12:00 midnight.

The open class dairy show will be held on Saturday immediately after the Junior Show.

Health and registration papers for cattle must accompany animals, and will be checked while cattle are unloaded. BE ACCURATE.

No hay or bedding may be stored in barns.

Power washers may not be used at Fair.

There must be competition for champion ribbons.

Entries must be made by July 31 of exhibit year.
