

DEPARTMENT 002 – BEEF CATTLE

Fair Year: 2018

Judging will be on Friday beginning at 2:30 pm.
Open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Beef project or youth of other groups doing equivalent work.

Entries must be made by July 31 of exhibit year.

Note: Requirements for entering the Market Animal Sale are listed in separate document.

No hay or bedding may be stored in the barns.

Definition of Age Classification – Beef Cattle

- a. A junior calf is one born on or after January 1 of exhibit year. The calf shall be at least 4 months old at the time of exhibit.
- b. A senior calf is one whose date of birth is between September 1 and December 31 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
- c. A summer yearling is one whose date of birth is between May 1 and August 31 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
- d. A junior yearling is one whose date of birth is between January 1 and April 30 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
- e. A senior yearling is one whose date of birth is between September 1 and December 31 of the second year preceding the exhibit year.
- f. A 2-year old or older cow is one born before September 1 of the second year preceding the exhibit year and which has calved during the last year.
- g. Bred and owned is defined as the dam/mother needs to be owned by the exhibitor or immediate family member.

DIVISION 20 – FEEDER STEERS

- a. A junior steer calf is one born after January 1 of exhibit year but must be 4 months old at exhibit time.
- b. A senior calf is one born during the period September 1 to December 31 of the year preceding the exhibit year.

- c. A summer yearling is one born during the period May 1 to August 31 of the year preceding exhibit year, and which has all milk teeth in place.
- d. A junior yearling is one born during the period January 1 to April 30 of the year preceding exhibit year and which has all milk teeth in solidly and shows no nicking at gums.
