To be eligible for the Flowers Award, the youth must exhibit 5 or more entries in the cut flowers, bouquets, and/or flower arrangement categories. To be eligible for the House Plant Award, the youth must exhibit 5 or more entries in the House Plant

To be eligible for the Plant Craft Award, the youth must exhibit 3 or more entries in the Plant Craft category.

To be considered for the award, you must sign up with the superintendent or clerk on entry day.
