COMMUNICATION

Open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Communication project or youth of other groups doing equivalent work.

Class No.

1. Poster on a list of ground rules for family meetings
2. Poster or report about the five steps for dealing with conflict
3. Create a family scrapbook on special events: birthday book, holiday book, vacations book, etc.
4. Poster on how to conduct an interview
5. Poster, collage, report, or scrapbook about the things you learned from a person you interviewed
6. Any other communication exhibit

SPEAKING

Open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Speaking project or youth of other groups doing equivalent work.

7. Poster showing the five (5) parts of a speech

8. Poster explaining different types of speeches including: informative, persuasive, entertaining (humorous or dramatic)
9. Collection of 2 or more items that document how you planned your speech
10. Poster of stress reduction tips and suggestions for dealing with speech anxiety
11. Any other public speaking exhibit

CREATIVE WRITING

Open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Creative Writing project or youth of other groups doing equivalent work.

12. Write a letter to your future self
13. Write a letter to a fictional character
14. Create a journal or diary (not your personal journal or diary)
15. Write and illustrate an original children's book
16. Create a booklet or scrapbook of original poetry
17. Any other piece of original creative writing (short story, essay, etc.)
